

High School Ethics Bowl Case Presentation Template

Think of your Ethics Bowl presentation as a 5-paragraph essay, with an introduction, several body paragraphs, and a conclusion. Structuring your presentation like this helps you organize your reasons and present them clearly. It breaks the case presentation into distinct sections, making it easier for judges and other teams to follow the presentation.

Note: The template below is meant to be flexible. Feel free to adjust and modify the format to fit your presentation needs.

Introduction:

- 1. Restate the question: summarize the case question you'll be discussing. *The question before us is* _____.
- Thesis: state your supporting reasons and acknowledge that you will address
 potential objections to your reasons.
